THIS 18-WEEK PROGRAM HAS TWO PARTS:

1. INTENSIVE ENGLISH COURSE

Spring Institute provides a six-week intensive (23 hours/week) English study course tailored to prepare participants for their training assignments. Part-time instruction for professional English also continues throughout the 12-week practical training.

2. PRACTICAL TRAINING COURSE

Training assignments, arranged through DIP, are generally 12 weeks in length in specific industries.
